

I wonder if you'd shake my hand? Somehow, I feel you will understand.

Well, I guess there isn't much more to say.

But, I am sure glad I met you today.

I guess the zero hour will soon be here, But I'm not afraid since I know you are near.

There's the signal...I've got to go. I like you lots, I want you to know.

Look now, this will be a horrible fight, Who knows, I may come to your house tonight.

Though I wasn't friendly to you before, I wonder if you'll wait at your door?

Look, I'm crying...me, shedding tears. I wish I had known you these many years.

Well, I have to go now, God, good-bye...

Strange, since I met you, I'm not afraid to die.

ELECTION DAY – TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8

This is a most important election not just for our country but also for Oakham.

Don't forget, you will receive 2 separate ballots this year.

The first ballot will be for choosing the leaders (president and vice-president) of our country for the next 4 years, our state senator and our state rep. Also, there will be a series four questions for you to think about. The results of these questions will help govern the direction in which our state will go. PLEASE, study the voter advisory that came in the mail that explains these questions. If you did not receive one or if you want one with large print, please let us know, we have them at the senior center. Think carefully before voting.

The second and smaller ballot contains two questions to determine how the town will pay some of its debt.

The first question is asking for a yes or no vote for a 2 ½ over ride

The second question is for a debt exclusion to help pay a town bond due each year to pay for the municipal building.

See you all there!!! Voting is your right and responsibility. How lucky we are to have it. Thank a vet for keeping it safe.
