More important health insurance changes are coming and we want you to have accurate information.

If you have a Medicare Prescription Drug Plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan (HMO or PPO) you should be receiving information from your health plan by the end of September. IT IS IMPORTANT to understand and to save this information because it explains the changes in your plan for 2015. During the annual MEDICARE OPEN

ENROLLMENT OCTOBER 15 – DECEMBER 7, 2014 you will have the opportunity to change your plan for next year. Did you find yourself in the **DONUT HOLE** this year? Come and learn how to avoid this situation in 2015.

WEATHER EMERGENCIES

Like it or not winter storms are on the horizon.

It is important to be prepared well in advance of any possible emergency. Having an Emergency Disaster Kit on hand is a great way to plan ahead. Be proactive!

In each kit everyone should have the Oakham Preparedness Handbook that we all received last year in the mail in an easily accessible place. The handbook will tell you exactly what the town's emergency plans are. Check to be sure that you have completed all of your key family information on the inside cover of the handbook

Everyone should have at least a 3 to 5 day supply of food and water in the emergency disaster kit. Stock up! Build your kit over a few weeks. When you go to the store buy an extra item or two to include in the kit.

Have one gallon of water for each person in your house for each day.

Food to place in the kit should include:

Peanut butter and jelly Canned meats, tuna fish, ham, chicken

Crackers

Canned fruits and veggies

Fruit juices

Bread, cookies

Medications

Flashlights and batteries

Personal Hygiene items

Other items: Shovel, axe, sewing kit, first aid supplies, and battery operated radios, etc.

This is just a short list of important items to have on hand. You will find a more detailed checklist in the Oakham handbook on page 5. Read and become familiar with all the helpful information before an emergency occurs.
